Originating on the northern coast of Galicia, the Camino Inglés was the fifth most walked Camino de Santiago in 2017. Most people begin in Ferrol, giving a 116km route to Santiago that takes four to six days. An alternative start in A Coruña gives a walk of 73km. The guidebook also details the Ruta do Mar, a 190km coastal link between the Camino del Norte and Camino Inglés from Ribadeo, and the Camino Finisterre from Santiago to the Atlantic.

The Camino Inglés offers many of the same qualities that make the Camino Francés so popular, including reliable waymarking, consistent pilgrim hostels, and the opportunity to earn the Compostela certificate. The less well-known Ruta do Mar lacks the same pilgrim infrastructure, but for those seeking solitude it offers striking and memorable scenery.

The guidebook is broken into stages, most of which end in a town or village with a pilgrim albergue. It describes the route along with indispensable information on facilities, food and lodging, 1:1000 scale maps of the route and town maps for key locations. With notes on preparation and planning, travel and equipment, a list of useful sources of information, and a glossary, the book provides all you need to know to walk the camino.
