Guidebook to walking in the Chilterns, an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty stretching through Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire. Despite its relative proximity to the country's capital, the region abounds in peace and tranquility making it an idyllic destination for a day's walk in the countryside. This guide describes 35 walks, ranging from 4 to 12 miles. Covering relatively low-level terrain (though there are some steep climbs and descents) the routes should be suitable for most walkers.

A chalky landscape famed for its beech and oak woods, the Chilterns showcase an impressive array of natural delights. Walkers can wander along dappled forest tracks, over high escarpments, through valleys and beside rivers. There are also Iron Age forts to discover, thatched villages to explore, stately homes to marvel at and medieval churches to admire.

Clear and concise route description is accompanied by OS map extracts. Information on the region's geology, history and fauna is also provided, as is practical advice on accommodation, transport and refreshments.

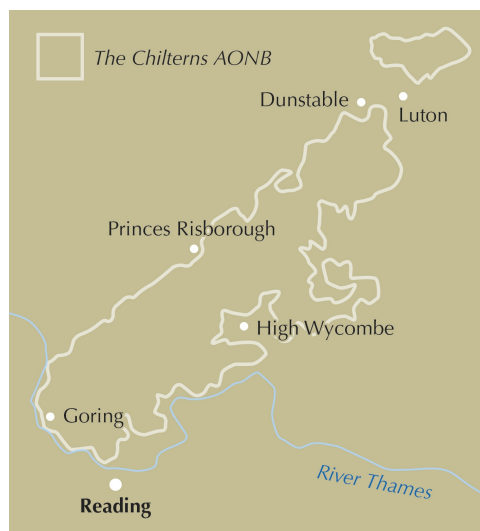
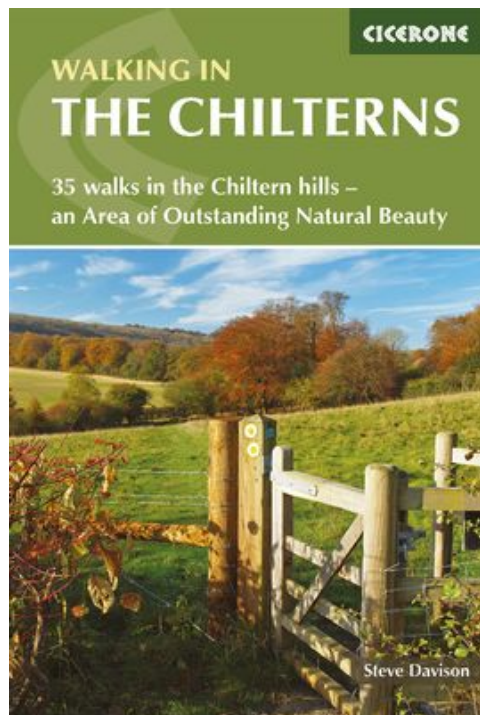
